We took time over the last few weeks to recharge and spend quality time with our family, and we hope you did as well. We thank you for your business in 2024 and look forward to working with you in 2025!

SEED SUPPLY

- Corn supply is tight or sold out on some of the top selling products and new products. If there are any adjustments that have to be made on invoices, we will give you a call. The following hybrids are <u>sold out</u>: P135050AM, P13777PCE, P13777V, P13841PCUE, P14830AML
- Supply on soybeans still looks very good. Our bulk bins are filled with both A-Series and Z-Series Enlist E3 Soybeans (P37A18E, P37Z06E, P40Z57E, P43Z44E). Soybeans that have been delivered are good germ and seed quality. The following variety is sold out: P37Z06E.

AGRONOMY TEXT UPDATES | During the growing season, Jeff sends out agronomy text updates from our Pioneer Field Agronomist. If you are not currently on the distribution list and would like to be, please call or text Jeff to be added.

HARVEST/YIELD MAPS | We have a majority of the yield maps made for customers' 2024 harvest data. If you still have harvest data that you would like maps created for, please bring us your flash drives and we can get these processed. If you are running JD Link or AgFiniti, we can wirelessly transfer this data without downloading to a flash drive.

TURF PRODUCTS & SPRING FORAGES | We have Kentucky 31, lawn seed, lawn fertilizer, Crabgrass Preventer, & Weed 'n Feed in stock for any spring lawn seeding or maintenance needs. We can also get spring forages & pasture mixes.

IN-SEASON SUPPLY & PRICING | For those who prepaid for corn and soybeans, remember that one of the benefits of pre-paying is getting that same discount for ANY extra seed or in-season seed. As ground changes hands this time of year due to rental agreements or land sales, there are always customers that need seed for new farms. Seed purchased for these new farms get the same discount you locked in by the pre-pay date. In addition, any extra seed picked up during planting season gets the same discount.

- Example 1: You prepaid for 100 bags in December, but just rented a new farm and now need an additional 24 bags. Those 24 additional bags are discounted the same as your first 100 bags.
- Example 2: You prepaid for 48 bags in December, but this spring you need 3 more bags to finish up. Those 3 extra bags picked up during planting season are discounted the same as your original 48 bags.

FIELD PLANNING | Many of you are already utilizing our Field Planner program to place products on your specific fields and get a plan in place for planting season. This program is a valuable resource to your operation and saves time in the spring by keeping products and planting rates correct for your specific fields. For those who are not using this program and would like to, there is still time to sit down with us before spring to get a field by field plan printed for your operation.



P13841AML

P13841AML is a 113 day versatile corn hybrid suitable for a wide variety of acres. It's an Aquamax hybrid with impressive stability on tougher soils and in drought conditions, but also brings impressive top end yield potential for productive more acres.

P36Z04E

P36Z04E is a NEW Z-Series soybean that will be in our test plots this growing season. It's a Peking variety, which gives us added protection against Soybean Cyst Nematode. lt's shorter season companion product to P37Z06E, and is well suited for those "inbetween" and tougher acres.
